

LOCAL LAW NO. 5 of 1925.

A Local Law

Providing for the appointment, duties, salaries and terms of office of the Health Officer and Poor Doctor.

Section 1. The office of health officer and city physician as prescribed in the Charter of the City of Plattsburgh is hereby abolished.

~~Section 2. The Board of Health of said city shall appoint~~ the following administrative officers, who shall not be members of said Board:

(a) A health officer, who shall be a competent physician and who shall have all the powers and duties of a local health officer, as prescribed in the general laws of this State. The term of office of the health officer shall be four (4) years, and he shall hold office until the appointment of his successor. He shall receive an annual salary of not to exceed twelve hundred and fifty dollars (\$1250.00).


(b) A city poor doctor, who shall be a competent physician and whose duty it shall be under the direction of the Commissioner of Charities to visit at their places of abode such of the poor of the city as may be ill, and give medical attention and care to the same as their condition shall require. The term of office of the city poor doctor shall be two years, and he shall hold office until the appointment of his successor. He shall receive an annual salary of not to exceed six hundred dollars (\$600.00), payable out of the poor fund.

Section 3. Sections 7, 10, 11, 32 and 116 of Chapter 269 of the Laws of 1902, and acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, and any other conflicting sections of said acts or local laws, in so far as they conflict with the provisions of this local law, are hereby superseded.

Section 4. This local law shall take effect January 1, 1926.

At a Regular Meeting of the Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, N. Y., held at the City Hall December 4, 1925.

The following Local Law No. 4 of 1925, having been regularly introduced in final form November 20, 1925, was again introduced for final passing by Alderman *ARBINGER*; seconded by Alderman *LAMAR*,

LOCAL LAW NO. 4 OF 1925.

A. Local Law

Amending Local Law No. 1, of 1925, entitled "An Act to supersede Section 11 of the Charter of the City of Plattsburgh and Local Law No. 2<sup>(1924)</sup> in relation to salaries of certain City officers and employees."

Be it enacted by the Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, as follows:-

Section 1. Local Law No. 1 of 1925, superseding Section 11 of Chapter 269 of the Laws of 1902, entitled "An Act to Incorporate the City of Plattsburgh" and superseding Local Law No. 2 of 1924, is hereby amended to read as follows:-

Section 11. Compensation of city officers. Members of the Board of education, except the clerk, and members of the board of health, shall receive no compensation for their services. The annual salary of the Mayor shall be eighteen hundred dollars, six hundred dollars of which shall be paid out of the water fund. The aldermen shall each receive five dollars for each meeting of the Common Council actually attended, but not in excess of two hundred and fifty dollars each per year. The annual salary of the city judge shall be twelve hundred dollars; the annual salary of the city clerk shall be fixed by the common council at a sum not to exceed nineteen hundred and twenty dollars, six hundred dollars of which shall be paid out of the water fund; the annual salary of the city chamberlain shall be thirteen hundred dollars, six hundred dollars of which shall be paid out of the water fund, but he shall receive no fees or additional compensation whatever; the


annual salary of the commissioner of charities shall be fixed by the common council at a sum not to exceed six hundred dollars; the annual salary of the health officer and city physician shall be one thousand dollars, which shall include all expenses for medicines furnished to the poor under his charge. The annual compensation of each assessor shall be two hundred dollars; the corporation counsel shall receive such annual salary as shall be agreed upon by the common council, not exceeding one thousand dollars; the superintendent of public works shall receive such an annual salary as may be approved by the common council, not exceeding two thousand dollars; the chief of police, an annual salary to be fixed by the common council not to exceed fifteen hundred dollars; the patrolmen, and special policemen shall receive a monthly salary to be fixed by the common council; the supervisors and constables shall be entitled to the same compensation for their services as the corresponding officers in towns are entitled to receive for like service; the inspectors of election and such other officers as are authorized to be appointed, shall receive such compensation as shall be fixed by the common council. Salaried officers by the year or month shall be paid ratably if actual service shall be less than the full term. No other appointive officer of the city shall be entitled to receive from the city any compensation for his services, unless otherwise provided by this act or by a general law. Whenever any police officer or fireman shall have served as patrolman or as chief and patrolman or as chief and fireman for more than five years the common council may, in its discretion, increase the salary of such chief, patrolman or fireman to an amount not exceeding ten per centum of the salary fixed by this act.

Section 2. This local law shall take effect January first, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.
