LOCAL LAW NO. 11 of 1944.

ENTITLED AN ACT to amend Section 3 of Local Law No. 5 of 1942 by providing for a seven (7%) per cent increase in the salaries of all positions listed under said Section 3 excepting the positions of Business Manager, Plant Superintendent, First Class Lineman, Electric Meter Serviceman, Lineman Helper and Stock Clerk, for the duration of World War No. 2 and for a period of six months thereafter.


SECTION 1. Effective June 1, 1944 the annual salaries attached to all positions listed under Section 3 of Local Law No. 5 of 1942, excepting the positions of Business Manager, Plant Superintendent, First Class Lineman, Electric Meter Serviceman, Lineman Helper and Stock Clerk, shall be increased by seven (7%) per cent, said increase to be regarded as war emergency compensation, and to continue in force for the duration of World War No. 2 and for a period of six months thereafter.

SECTION 2. No part of the additional war emergency compensation received under this act shall be regarded as salary or compensation for any of the purposes of any pension or retirement system in which the officer or employee receiving the same is a member, and the receipt of such additional compensation shall not be deemed to change the basic compensation of any such officer or employee for the purpose of computing a pension, retirement allowance, death benefit, contribution in connection with such membership, or for the purpose of determining any other right or privilege resulting from or appertaining to such membership or for the purpose of determining the right to any increase of salary or any salary increment. No such additional compensation shall be construed to constitute a promotion or to increase any compensation which a public employee may receive pursuant to section two hundred forty-five of the military law.

SECTION 3. This Local Law shall take effect as of June 1, 1944 after public hearing and approval by the Mayor.


