LOCAL LAW NO. 2 of 1949.

ENTITLED AN ACT to amend Section 11 of Chapter 269 of the Laws of 1902 as amended by various Local Laws to date and in this instance providing for the compensation of the City Judge, Acting City Judge and the Superintendent of Public Works and further amending Section 11B of Chapter 269 of the Laws of 1902 providing for the minimum and maximum compensation and the rate of increase and time of taking effect of such increase for certain employees in the Department of Public Works of the City of Plattsburgh and also providing for the compensation of the Clerk of the City Court.

BE IT ENACTED by the Mayor and the Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, New York as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 11 of Chapter 269 of the Laws of 1902 as amended to date is hereby amended as follows:

Paragraph 11 of said section relating to the salary of the City Judge shall read as follows:

The salary of the City Judge shall be \$2800 per year all of which shall be payable from the City Court and/or the Police Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts.

Paragraph 12 of said section regarding the salary of the Acting City Judge shall read as follows:

The salary of the Acting City Judge shall be \$8.00 for each day during which he sits but not to exceed the sum of \$400 in any one year all of which shall be payable from the City Court and/or the Police Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts.

Paragraph 18 of said section regarding the salary of the Superintendent of Public Works shall read as follows:

The salary of the Superintendent of Public Works, upon appointment, shall be \$4000.00 per year, the same to be increased at the rate of \$100 per year until the maximum salary of \$5000.00 is attained. Of that figure, 50% shall be payable by the Water Department; the sum of \$500.00 shall be payable by the Municipal Airport Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts, and the balance shall be payable from the Street and Sewer Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts.

SECTION 2. Section 11B of Chapter 269 of the Laws of 1902 relating to the salary of the Clerk of the City Court shall read as follows: The salry of the Clerk of the City Court shall be \$2400.00 per year all of which shall be payable from the Police Court or Police Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts.

In the schedule of salaries for the Department of Public Works the following shall be the maximum, minimum and increment as provided in Column 1-2-3 for the following positions,

HOURLY WAGE RATES

Skilled Laborers shall receive \$1.10 per hour; semi-skilled laborers shall receive \$1.05 per hour and common laborers shall receive \$1.00 per hour which shall be payable either from the General Budgetary Accounts (Street and Sewer Fund or Sewer Operation and Maintenance Fund) or from the Water Department, according to the classification of labor performed.

SECTION 3. Laws Repealed. All laws inconsistent with this Act are hereby superceded.

SECTION 4. Time of Taking Effect. This act shall become effective as of January 28th after public hearing and approval by the Mayor.
