## LOCAL LAW NO. 2 of 1950.

ENTITLED A LOCAL LAW amending Section 5 of Local Law No.

1 of 1936 respecting the method of service and in this instance providing for the appointment of a Business Manager and a Plant Superintendent.

BE IT ENACTED by the Mayor and the Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, New York, as follows:

Section 1. Section 5 of Local Law No.1 of 1936 is hereby amended to read as follows:

ment, operation and maintenance of the project shall be under the supervision and control of a "Municipal Lighting Department" which is hereby created and which shall have jurisdiction and supervision of the furnishing of the services afforded by the project, subject to the Common Council. The Municipal Lighting Department shall be operated under the direction of a Business Manager and a Plant Superintendent. Such positions shall be in the classified Civil Service and appointments shall be made by the Mayor subject to the approval and confirmation by the Common Council. The duties of the Business Manager and Plant Superintendent shall be such duties as they are performing under the Civil

Service classification and plan which was adopted May 21st,1942. The Common Council may prescribe such rules and regulations for the conduct and operation of the Municipal Lighting Department as it may deem advisable. All employees of the Municipal Lighting Department shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the Municipal Civil Service Commission.

Section 2. Time of Taking Effect. This local law shall take effect immediately upon approval thereof by the affirmative of a majority of the qualified electors of said city voting at a special election to be held April 15th,1950 upon the following propositions:

"Shall Section 5 be amended to read as follows:"

Section 5. Method of Furnishing Service. The management, operation and maintenance of the project shall be under the supervision and control of a "Municipal Lighting Department" which is hereby created and which shall have jurisdiction and supervision of the furnishing of the services afforded by the project, subject to the Common Council. The Municipal Lighting Department shall be operated under the direction of a Business Manager and a Plant Superintendent.
