LOCAL LAW NO. 4 OF 1932.

ENTITLED AN ACT to amend Section 153 of the Charter of the City of Plattsburgh, N.Y., being part of Chapter 269 of the Laws of 1902 of the State of New York, providing for the issuance of tax receipts.


BE IT ENACTED by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, N.Y., that Section 153 of the City Charter shall be superseded by the following:

SECTION 153: Tax Receipts: Immediately upon receiving any tax the Chamberlain shall enter in a column prepared for the purpose and opposite the names of the persons or corporations paying the same, the fact of payment and the date thereof, and shall give the person paying the same a receipt therefor. The City Clerk shall cause all tax receipts to be printed and numbered, the same to be in triplicate, each original, duplicate and triplicate to bear the same number as the original. The Common Council is hereby authorized to employ within the amount provided in the budget of each fiscal year, additional clerical help for the purpose of preparing current tax bills. The City Chamberlain is directed to mail to each taxpayer, by depositing in the post office of the City of Plattsburgh, N.Y., properly enclosed in a postpaid wrapper, a statement showing the description of his or her property and the amount of taxes due thereon. Any person may pay any one or more taxes or assessments upon his or her property, leaving others unpaid to be enforced in the manner provided by subsequent sections of the City Charter.

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon approval.

On roll call Aldermen Holland, Roach, Raymond, Light, Spearman and Shay voted in the affirmative. No one in the negative.  
**CARRIED.**

The foregoing Local Law is hereby approved after Public Hearing held this 26th day of February 1932.
