LOCAL LAW NO. 6 of 1976

AN ACT ESTABLISHING RESIDENCE REQUIREMENTS FOR EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF PLATTSBURGH, NEW YORK

BE IT ENACTED by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, New York as follows:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> From and after the effective date of this Local Law, all applicants seeking employment with the City of Plattsburgh must, at the time of their application and for at least four (4) months prior thereto, be a resident of the City of Plattsburgh.

SECTION II: Any such applicant so employed by the City of Plattsburgh or any present employee now living in the City of Plattsburgh, shall continue to maintain his residence within the City during the term of his employment, and shall forfeit his position if he fails so to do.

SECTION III: Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Civil Service Commission of the City of Plattsburgh may suspend said residence requirements where there is difficulty in recruiting competent employees and such residence requirements would prove disadvantageous to the public interest.

SECTION IV: Laws Repealed. All other provisions and special acts or local laws, including Chapter 269 of the Laws of 1902, known as the City Charter as amended by various local laws, inconsistent with the provisions of this act, are hereby superseded.

On roll call, Aldermen Burke, Stewart, Blumette, Griffin and Poitras voted in the affirmative; Alderman Haley voting in the negative; CARRIED
