Local Law No. P-4 of the year 2020

A local law amending Chapter 300 "Subdivision of Land" and Chapter 360 "Zoning" of the City Code of the City of Plattsburgh to provide exemptions for City Projects.

This Local Law is enacted pursuant to the provisions of Sections 10 of the Municipal Home Rule Law of the State of New York.

Be it enacted by the Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh as follows:

1. The City Code of the City of Plattsburgh is amended by adding Section 300-36 "City Exemption" to the City Code of the City of Plattsburgh to read as follows:

Chapter 300 "Subdivision of Land"... Section 36 "City Exemption"

A. Purpose and Intent; Authority

It is the intent of this Local Law to specifically provide for the exemption of City projects and activities from the City's Subdivision of Land Regulations. It is adopted pursuant to New York Municipal Home Rule Law.

B. City Exemption

Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, any action or subdivision proposed or undertaken by the City of Plattsburgh, or on behalf of the City with the City's written authorization, shall be exempt from the provisions of this chapter. Notwithstanding this exemption, the Common Council may seek non-binding advisory review from the City Planning Board and/or Zoning Board of Appeals for any such proposed City action. This exemption specifically does not apply to the provisions of the State Environmental Review Act (SEQRA) or other State or Federal requirements, but is limited only to requirements of the City of Plattsburgh.

2. The City Code of the City of Plattsburgh is amended by adding Section 360-62 "City Exemption" to the City Code of the City of Plattsburgh to read as follows:

Chapter 360 "Zoning"... Section 62 "City Exemption"

A. Purpose and Intent; Authority

It is the intent of this Local Law to specifically provide for the exemption of City projects and activities from the City's Zoning Code. It is adopted pursuant to New York Municipal Home Rule Law.

B. City Exemption

Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, any action, including but not limited to site plan review, subdivision approval, planned unit development review, special use permit application, use variance or area variance application, which is proposed or undertaken by the City of Plattsburgh, or on behalf of the City with the City's written authorization, shall be exempt from the provisions of this chapter. Notwithstanding this exemption, the Common Council may seek non-binding advisory review from the City Planning Board and/or Zoning Board of Appeals for any such proposed City action. This exemption specifically does not apply to the provisions of the State Environmental Review Act (SEQRA) or other State or Federal requirements, but is limited only to requirements of the City of Plattsburgh.

3. Severability

The invalidity of any clause, sentence, paragraph or provision of this Local Law shall not invalidate any other clause, sentence, paragraph or part thereof.

4. Repealer

Any Local Laws or Ordinances or parts of Local Laws or Ordinances in conflict with any part of this Local Law are hereby repealed.

5. Effective Date

This Local Law shall take effect upon approval by the Mayor and filing with the New York Secretary of State. However, this City Exemption does not apply to any previous application pending review before the City Planning Board and/or Zoning Board of Appeals as of the effective date of this Local Law.
