4. **NEW BUSINESS:**

Councilor Gibbs spoke about fire pits in back yards, would like to amend code to ban/prohibit back yard fire pits.

Corporation Counsel Schneller indicated it would need to go through Local Law process, public hearing, etc. He would need to research and review first amendment rights, religious reasons, etc. Explained current law and possible options.

Councilor Ensel mentioned majority of complaints are safety and respiratory health of other residents.

Councilor Armstrong asked who would respond to complaints.

Police Chief Ritter indicated Police Department would respond.

Councilor Gibbs asked Police Chief for background on why blotter is no longer accessible on website.

Police Chief Ritter indicated they had a software upgrade which didn't support the script that was written special for the website and to have that done it would cost a few thousand dollars and he didn't feel it was worth spending the money on that. They fax information to media daily.

Mayor Read indicated in researching Socrata it may be a feature available through that system.
